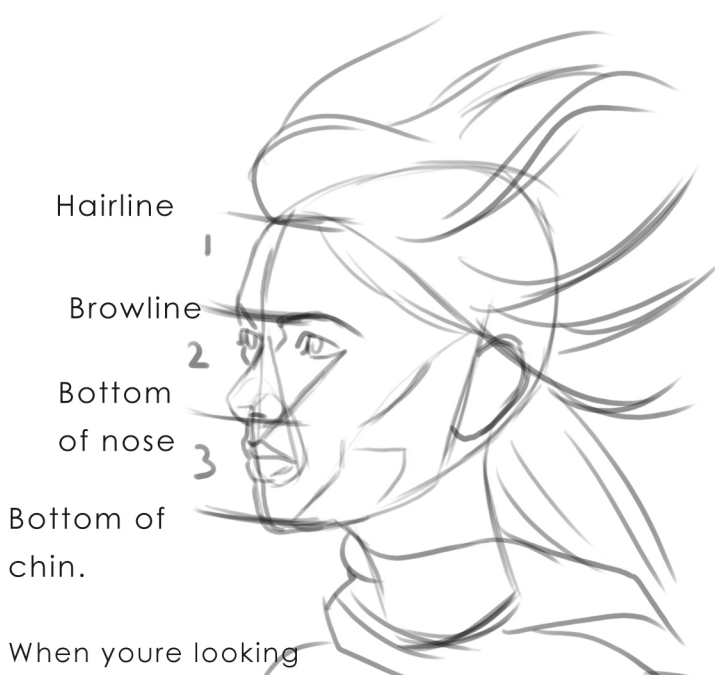




Rather than start with the small details and work out from there it's better to start with the bigger shapes. The head seen from this angle is about as wide as it is high. The eyes generally are on a line halfway from the top of the head to the bottom. (top)



(left) You can use balls for eyes to start to just make sure the size and spacing is right. You can see here too the ear attaches to the jawline on the same line as the eyes and the bottom of the ear is on the same line as the nose.



When you're looking straight on at a person and their head isn't tilted up or down, the above features are all normally equal distances. There are two other lines, one from the corner of the eye, through the corner of the nostril and that ends at the middle of the top lip. The other one goes from the middle point between the eyes again through the corner of the nostril and then meets the outside of the mouth.
